- · BREATHING: SLOW, SHALLOW OR STOPPED
- **BLUE LIPS & FINGERTIPS**
- GRAY, CLAMMY SKIN/VOMITING · SLOW PULSE/NO PULSE
- LOUD SNORING OR GURGLING NOISE ("DEATH RATTLE")
 - · PERSON IS UNRESPONSIVE

1. GET THEIR ATTENTION

- · GIVE THEM A SHAKE AND YELL, "HEY, ARE YOU OKAY?"
- · RUB YOUR KNUCKLES UP AND DOWN THEIR BREAST BONE.



TELL THE DISPATCHER YOUR LOCATION AND THE PERSON'S SYMPTOMS.

3. PERFORM RESCUE BREATHING

- · MAKE SURE NOTHING IS IN THEIR MOUTH
- · TILT HEAD BACK, LIFT CHIN, PINCH NOSE
- · GIVE ONE BREATH EVERY FIVE SECONDS
- · IF NO PULSE, GIVE CHEST COMPRESSIONS.

4. ADMINISTER NALOXONE (NARCAN®)

IF YOU HAVE IT. AFTER GIVING NALOXONE, STAY WITH THE PERSON UNTIL MEDICAL ASSISTANCE ARRIVES.

5. PLACE IN RECOVERY POSITION

IF YOU HAVE TO LEAVE THE PERSON ALONE, LAY THEM ON THEIR LEFT SIDE TO PREVENT THEM FROM CHOKING IF THEY VOMIT.
